Evaluation & Action Plans

“Commit to the LORD whatever you do, and He will establish your plans.” Proverbs 16:3

After days of discussion, planning, and determination, the CRCA team is pleased to present its 20 page report, combining a summary on CRCA ministry in 2010 and a strategic plan for action for the remainder of 2011! The report is available to you upon request, but, for the time-conscious reader, please find below an abridged synopsis.

CRCA ministry in 2010 was demanding yet fruitful. A permanent goal that CRCA successfully met in 2010 is to become increasingly self-sustainable. 2010 saw an increase of close to \$30,000 in internal revenue generation from the previous year, amounting to \$53,986.17 self-raised funds. 2010 saw a total of 46 Jesus Film showings with over 10,000 attendants. A numeration of 68 CRCA churches and preaching points showed that 21 churches saw growth in attendance in 2010, in comparison with the previous year. Thirteen churches were established in 2010. Pray for continued growth not just in attendants but in spiritual strength and wisdom in facing the inevitable persecutions that the church will face.

Overall, CRCA's primary goal in the previous years and continuing in 2011 and beyond is **the maintenance of an evangelistic-mission minded focus for the local and global expansion of God's Kingdom**. This reflects the heart of CRCA ministry, found in Matthew 28:19-20 "...make disciples of all the nations...*teaching* them all that I have commanded you..." Faith goals for 2011 are an extension of last year's goals, namely the strengthening of existing ministries and the continued expansion and growth into new areas. Conferences, retreats, training opportunities, site visits, and strategic, Spirit-led partnerships will all contribute toward these goals.

To plan effective methods to meet these goals, each CRCA ministry was investigated and probed to improve the most needed areas of development. Thus, CRCA is prayerfully seeking and planning improvement in the following ministries: evangelism, projects, schools, and communication.

Evangelism

CRCA is particularly excited about some expansions of influence in Cape Mount County, Buluyema Forest (reached only on foot or by air), neighboring Guinea, and the Republic of Gambia. The CRCA Jesus Film team is also thrilled about upgrading their current showings by 100 events per year, an increase from 46 showings in 2010 to a minimum of 144 showings in 2011. In prayer with CRCA intercessors, the team is hoping to expose 57,600 in 2011 to the gospel message, succeeded by follow-ups, discipleship, and periodic visits. Five additional persons were recruited to serve as evangelists in this particular ministry and to help maintain increased responsibilities.

Projects

Some anticipated (and ongoing) projects include the completion of Konia Christian Revival High School, continued education for CRCA pastors, final touch ups at churches in Kpassagizia, Borkeza, & Buluyema Forest, and a medical center in Kpassagizia. Current business projects will see some adjustments in order to secure efficiency. For example, a dysfunctional rice mill in Konia will be repaired and relocated to Tumukolia where it can be of better use. Already in February of this year a team from Austria was able to develop and complete an agricultural farm in Kpondoh Town, complete with 9 breeding rabbits and 800+ pineapple plants! The profits generated from the rabbits and plants will help improve the CRCA school building in Kpondoh Town and begin a fund for a church building.

Schools

One major objective is to improve the management and quality of CRCA schools while continuing to add more projects, specifically in new areas of ministry, for the purpose of sustainability. CRCA's budget includes funds allotted for teachers' continued education and a new school coordinator, welcomed by CRCA on March 1, 2011. CRCA schools are required to fundraise through gardening, farming, livestock projects, and school sponsored programs. This will help pay teachers' salaries and create a fund for the establishment of new schools.

Communication

In the area of communication, plans to improve contact with coordinators and CRCA representatives nationally and overseas, such as holding quarterly meetings and requiring in-field updates, will improve transparency within the association. Additionally, CRCA is planning to launch its new website by summer 2011!
